

Donna Skinner awarded 2nd place ribbon at Orange County Fair Art exhibit.

A group of Donna's Soroptimist sisters gathered together to view Donna's award winning entry, "American Woman," stroll the fair, and eat fair cuisine.

Mira Dujanovic, Donna's friend, was the model and inspiration for "American Woman," the mixed media piece that won a 2nd place ribbon at the 2016 OC Fair Fine Art competition.

Donna's description of her work is as follows: "The background for the piece is scraps of advertisements from newspaper. (When I developed the background, I had recently been to see Gustav Klimt's 1907 por-



trait of Adele Bloch-Bauer ... the one with the gold leaf background. The gold leaf reflected the wealth and privilege of Bloch-Bauer.) I thought the newsprint was an appropriate contrast and background for a woman who had a different kind of history ... one of hard work, struggle and sacrifice ... the story of an immigrant who came to this country to raise her children and eventually to become a naturalized American citizen. My goal was to draw her in a way to show that she is somewhat saintly and fiercely determined.





Nancy Hegelheimer was honored on October 13th at the Tichenor Clinic for Children's 90th Anniversary.

Nancy Mahan Hegelheimer served as the Executive Director at Tichenor for 23 years and as a physical therapist for 15 years! She inspired the staff with her work ethic, optimism, and compassion. Nancy served as a mentor to her staff, being both an excellent leader and skilled clinical physical therapist. She met

with each of the families who sought care at the Clinic and worked passionately to see that all children received the care that they needed.

Nancy was supported at the event by a large group of SILB members. Lori DeLaney, Executive Director, and Sally Lane, Chairperson of the Board, were among those who presented.









On October 16th at their Festival of Smiles 84th Anniversary Celebration, the Children's Dental Health Clinic honored Josephine Fitzpatrick.

When Josephine was a child, during the years before fluoride, she spent many hours in a dental chair. Dental disease followed her into her adult life, and Josephine joked that she'd rather have a baby than go to the dentist.

On a tour of CDHC, Josephine learned that the Clinic's mission was to serve children who might not otherwise receive care. She accepted a place on the Board of CDHC ten years ago, and somewhat to her surprise, found that dentists really are likeable.

Josephine is passionate about helping the most vulnerable in our society. She was honored for her guidance, advise, generosity of giving, sense of humor, understanding, kindness, and her dedication to the mission of the Children's Dental Health Clinic.

Jana Martin came from the East Coast to act as M.C. for the event, and several other SILB members and Josephine's husband Art were on hand to recognize her achievement.

Judy Pedneault honored by Meals on Wheels at their 45th Anniversary Celebration.

A Bit of History



This past summer I cleaned out an old file and found a batch of papers that turned out to be questionnaires sent out to SILB members in **1926.** The question was whether the club should continue supporting Rockhaven House, established in 1925 as our club's first community project, or turn it over to the city or school district to run. Apparently the question was answered in the affirmative as the club continued full support of the home until the 1933 Long Beach earthquake, when the house was damaged beyond repair.

What I found interesting were the rather intrusive questions at the beginning of the questionnaire and the members responses.

MEMBERSHIP IN OTHER CLUBS: ("L.B. Riders Club, YWCA, Ebell, Daughters of the Nile, Business and Professional Women's Club, Daughters of Veterans' League, P.T.A. etc)

CHURCH AFFILLIATION: ("Two Baptist, Three Catholic, Two Presbyterians, Four Episcopal, Five Congregation, Three Christian Scientist and Three Methodist)

MARRIED/SINGLE : (Evenly divided) Several had exclamation points behind "single!"

DATE OF BIRTH AND PLACE: (All gave place, not many gave year of birth. Of those that did, all were born before 1900. The oldest was born in 1867!)

FAVORITE HOBBY: (horse back riding, gardening, mushroom raising, home, work, motoring, and "civic betterment of my town of Long Beach")

SPORTS: (Swimming, motoring, Roque, tennis, golf, horseback riding etc. The oldest member stated she was "too old and stiff to take part in any sports".)

AUTOMOBILE/MAKE AND MODEL: (Three Studebakers, Two Chevrolets, Two Buicks, Three Nash, One Cadillac, One Hudson and One 1926 Franklin)
