On April 27, 2024, Soroptimist International of Long Beach (SILB) held its Sixteenth Annual Scholarship Luncheon. SILB's annual philanthropic commitment culminated in the awarding of \$26,000 to local individuals who are pursuing their dreams and educational goals. All who attended were inspired by the awardees' stories of overcoming obstacles of poverty, violence, and loss.

The afternoon began with a welcome from co-President Margo Wheeler. She welcomed invited dignitaries Lola Abrahamian, Camino Real Region Governor, Cynthia Jarvis, CRR Governor-Elect, Janice Kurihara CRR District 3 Director, Lisa Swett Sagario, Camino Real Region Live Your Dream Chairperson, and Jan Kellogg, CSULB Development Coordinator for Women & Philanthropy. Lunch followed with the following awards announced.

Soroptimist Live Your Dream Awards. The Soroptimist *Live Your Dream Award* provides a monetary award for women who are the primary wage earners in their families and are pursuing education and/or career training. There were eighteen recipients selected. Judy Murphy, chair of the Philanthropy Committee, introduced Lisa Swett Sagario, Camino Real Region Live Your Dream Chairperson and previous LYD awardee. Other presenters were Sue DeRuyter, Julia McConaghy and Jaye Johnson.

Renay O. I'm a student at LBCC pursuing an AA degree in math and science. I plan on going into the LVN program in the Fall of 2024 then to RN program once I've gained some experience in my field of study. My plan is to give back to my community and to help mothers complete their educational goals by modeling and counseling women.

I've rebuilt my life, seizing educational and professional opportunities to ensure a better future for my family. Currently, I'm pursuing my AA-T to transfer to a four-year university, determined to open even more doors for us. Step by step, I'm progressing towards my goals, fueled by the belief that anything is possible.

Quanesha. I am a first-generation college student, and single mother of three awesome children. I grew up in poverty and homelessness, and these things also showed up in my adult life. This May I will have accomplished my goal of becoming the very first in my family to receive a Bachelor's Degree. I will graduate with honors, completed the California College Corps cohort, serving over 450 hours in community service, am a member of The National Society and Leadership of Success, and am preparing for my Master's Degree in social work, slated for Fall 2025.

Mystique. I am currently in the nursing program at Cypress Community College. My hope is to earn my Associate Degree in Science by 2026. Ultimately, my goal is to be a Nurse Practitioner in the field of Gynecology. My focus is on helping women with their specific health needs.

Dr. Katherine White Achievement Award. This award is given to a previous SILB scholarship recipient. The award honors the memory of Dr. Katherine White, a dedicated leader in SILB for 43 years, and is made possible by a generous donation from Dr. White's family. Sally Lane introduced Candace Meehan Kuykendall, an SI Long Beach member and previous LYD and Katherine White award recipient.

This year's award recipient is Doshima. In her own words, "I am a previous 'Live Your Dream' winner and will receive my Bachelor's degree in Theatre Arts next month from Cal State University Long Beach. I have been accepted into the MFA Program (Master of Fine Arts) at UC Irvine where I will continue my formal education and earn the tools I need to be a professional actor. My goal is to complete my education and perform on Broadway. I lost my mother in 2021 and became guardian for my younger brother. I work hard balancing two jobs, attending school full-time, and handling responsibilities at home."

Women & Philanthropy. For over 25 years, Women & Philanthropy at California State University, Long Beach, has helped many of the non-traditional students work towards obtaining their degrees and has supported them to overcome obstacles in their path to graduation. All funds raised by donors to Women & Philanthropy are used to support student scholarships for reentry students looking to improve their lives through higher education.

Lori Brault introduced Jan Kellogg, who represented CSU Long Beach's Women & Philanthropy. Lori announced the Scholarship Awardee, Ali, who was not able to attend the luncheon.

Long Beach City College Scholarships. For the past 41 years, SILB and Long Beach City College Foundation have worked together to provide scholarships for women attending LBCC. Students are selected from both campuses, who are returning to LBCC in the Fall, transferring to a four-year college, or enrolled in a Vocational Education Certificate Program. The recipients may be enrolled in any career area, maintain a minimum 3.0 GPA, and demonstrate financial need. Victoria Wang presented this year's award recipients.

Elise. Once I complete my coursework at LBCC, I intend to transfer to a UC school and eventually earn my PhD in biochemistry. From there, I will pursue a career in disease research and pharmaceutical drug design. My ultimate dream is to be able to give people with chronic diseases hope and ensure medications are accessible to everyone.
